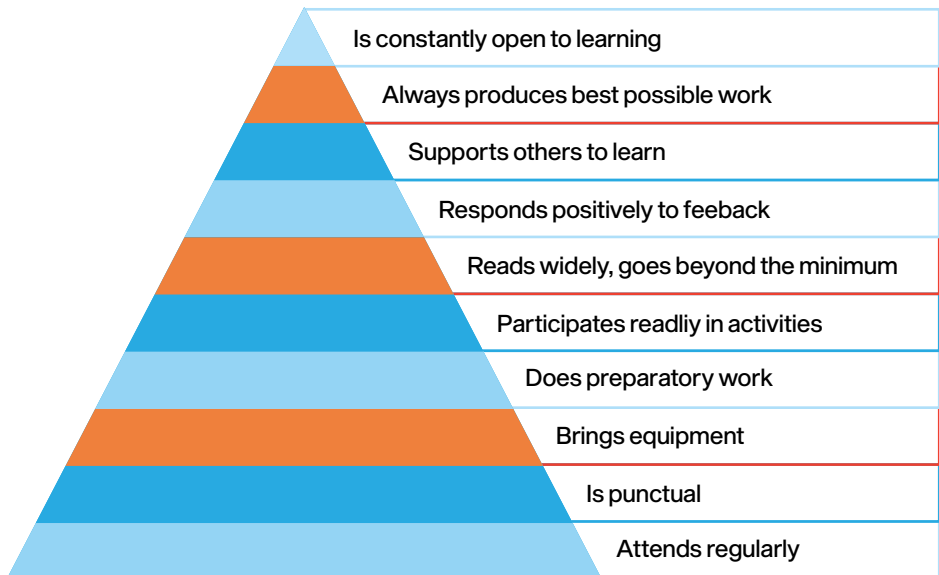


MISSION STATEMENT

WHAT ARE T-LEVELS ?

THE NEXT LEVEL QUALIFICATION

(TO START SEPTEMBER 2024)

T-Levels are new two-year, technical study programmes that will initially be available across 24 pathways in 11 industry routes. They are delivered in a classroom based environment with 20% of the time spent on an industry placement working in employer settings.

A New Choice

T-Levels are ideal if you have finished your GCSEs and want the knowledge and experience to get straight into employment, an apprenticeship or higher education. You'll spend 80% of your time in the classroom and 20% on a 45-day placement with an employer to give you the skills and knowledge companies look for.

Why choose a T-Level?

Created with Business

T-Levels have been designed with leading businesses and employers to give you the knowledge and skills you need.

More than 200 businesses have been involved so you can be confident your T-Level will move you to the next level. You will gain professional development and specific sector skills in a real work environment.

Get Ahead in Your Career

T-Levels give you the chance to learn what a real career is like while you continue your studies.

Your industry placement will last for at least 45 days – when and how you complete it depends on the T-Level, college and employer.

Qualifications That Count

When you pass your T-Level, you will get a nationally recognised certificate showing the overall grade you achieved – pass, merit, distinction or distinction*. It will also give details of what you learned on the course to help you move into skilled employment or a higher apprenticeship.

Awarded UCAS points

Your T-Level will be worth UCAS points – a T-Level Distinction* is worth the same as 3 A levels at A* – and will be recognised by universities and other education providers so you can choose to continue studying if you wish.

Learn Your Way

T-Levels involve more classroom study than apprenticeships, which means you can experience an industry while you continue your studies.

Like A levels, there are no tuition fees to study a T-Level if you start before you are 19.

BUSINESS: Management and Administration

This is a 2 year course equivalent to 3 A Levels and includes 9 weeks minimum working with an employer on an industry placement. On this course you will develop the core knowledge and skills that are needed for entry into a range of management and administration occupations including office manager, supervisor, medical secretary, civil service, personal assistant and barrister's clerk.

KEY TOPICS

- **business context** – an overview of organisational cultures and values, different types of internal and external stakeholders, different forms of governance and the impact of organisations on society and the environment
- **project and change management** – an understanding of the common change management theories and models and how to support and improve projects
- **business behaviours** – the importance of good communication and adapting social communication styles to professional standards and according to purpose, medium and audience
- **quality and compliance** – the importance of maintaining and improving quality in all aspects of public and private sector organisations

OPTIONS TO SPECIALISE

In addition to the core content, you will also complete at least one module of occupation specific content.

EDUCATION and CHILDCARE

This is a 2 year course equivalent to 3 A Levels and includes 9 weeks minimum working with an employer on an industry placement. This course prepares learners to work with children between birth and young people aged between birth and 19 years old and is suitable for anyone wanting a career in early years, primary, teaching and other related careers.

We offer one pathway: Early Years and Assisting Teaching. The Early Years pathway will give you a license to practice, enabling you to enter the workplace as a qualified Early Years Educator or manage an Early Years Setting. Successful completion of this course will also allow you to progress to university.

- understanding the education and childcare sector from ages 0 to 19
- child development
- safeguarding, health and safety and wellbeing
- understanding and managing behaviour
- observing and assessing children and young people
- equality and diversity
- special educational needs and disability

YOU WILL

- learn how to support children and young people's education
- work with parents, carers and wider families
- work with agencies and services that support children, families and carers
- participate in reflective practice and other forms of professional development



DIGITAL PRODUCTION, DESIGN and DEVELOPMENT

This is a 2 year course equivalent to 3 A Levels and includes 9 weeks minimum working with an employer on an industry placement. During the 2-year programme, you will learn the core knowledge and skills that are needed for entry to a range of digital occupations.

KEY TOPICS

You will develop an understanding of:

- how digital technologies impact business
- the ethical and moral implications of digital technology
- using data in software design
- using digital technologies to analyse and solve problems
- digital environments, including physical, virtual and cloud environments
- emerging technical trends, such as Internet of Things (IoT), Artificial Intelligence (AI), Augmented Reality (AR), Blockchain, 3D printing
- legal and regulatory obligations relating to digital technologies
- the privacy and confidentiality of personal data
- the technical, physical and human aspects of internet security
- planning digital projects
- testing software, hardware and data
- digital tools for project management and collaboration

OPTIONS TO SPECIALISE

In addition to the core content, each student will also develop skills in digital production, design and development. The content will include:

- analysing a problem to define requirements and acceptance criteria aligned to user needs
- designing, implementing, and testing software
- changing, maintaining and supporting software
- creating solutions in a social and collaborative environment
- discovering, evaluating, and applying reliable sources of knowledge
- applying ethical principles and managing risks in line with legal and regulatory requirements when developing software

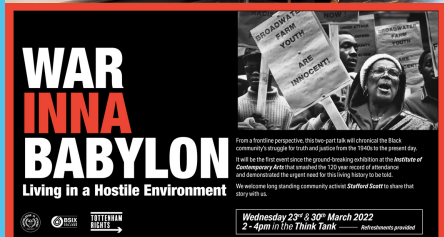
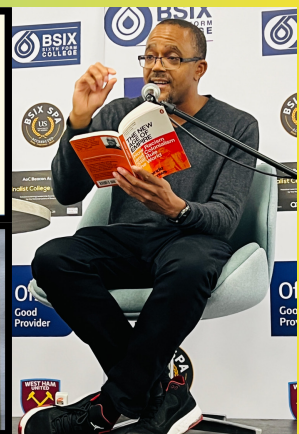

You can apply for financial support to help with the costs of college. Priority is given to young people in care, care leavers, young people on income support and disabled young people receiving employment support allowance or disability allowance. Free meals are provided to students that meet eligibility criteria and provide evidence of household income.

Tutoring

Every student is allocated a personal tutor who will meet with you weekly to provide guidance and support. Your tutor will monitor all aspects of your study programme and will help you to set targets to ensure you are successful. Your tutor will provide your reference and help you to apply for university, further training and jobs.

Learning Support

Our inclusive learning support has had a major impact on students' achievements. We are committed to providing an accessible learning environment which enables all students to be included in college life. We welcome students with learning difficulties and disabilities.

Safeguarding and Welfare

We are committed to safeguarding and promoting the welfare of our students. All students should be kept safe from harm, including any form of abuse, sexual exploitation or radicalisation. We protect our students from extremists who advocate violence, religious hatred, or racist, sexist or homophobic views. Our safeguarding officers also help with personal issues such as homelessness or health. If there is something an adviser cannot help you with, they will refer you to an external agency to get the practical support you need.

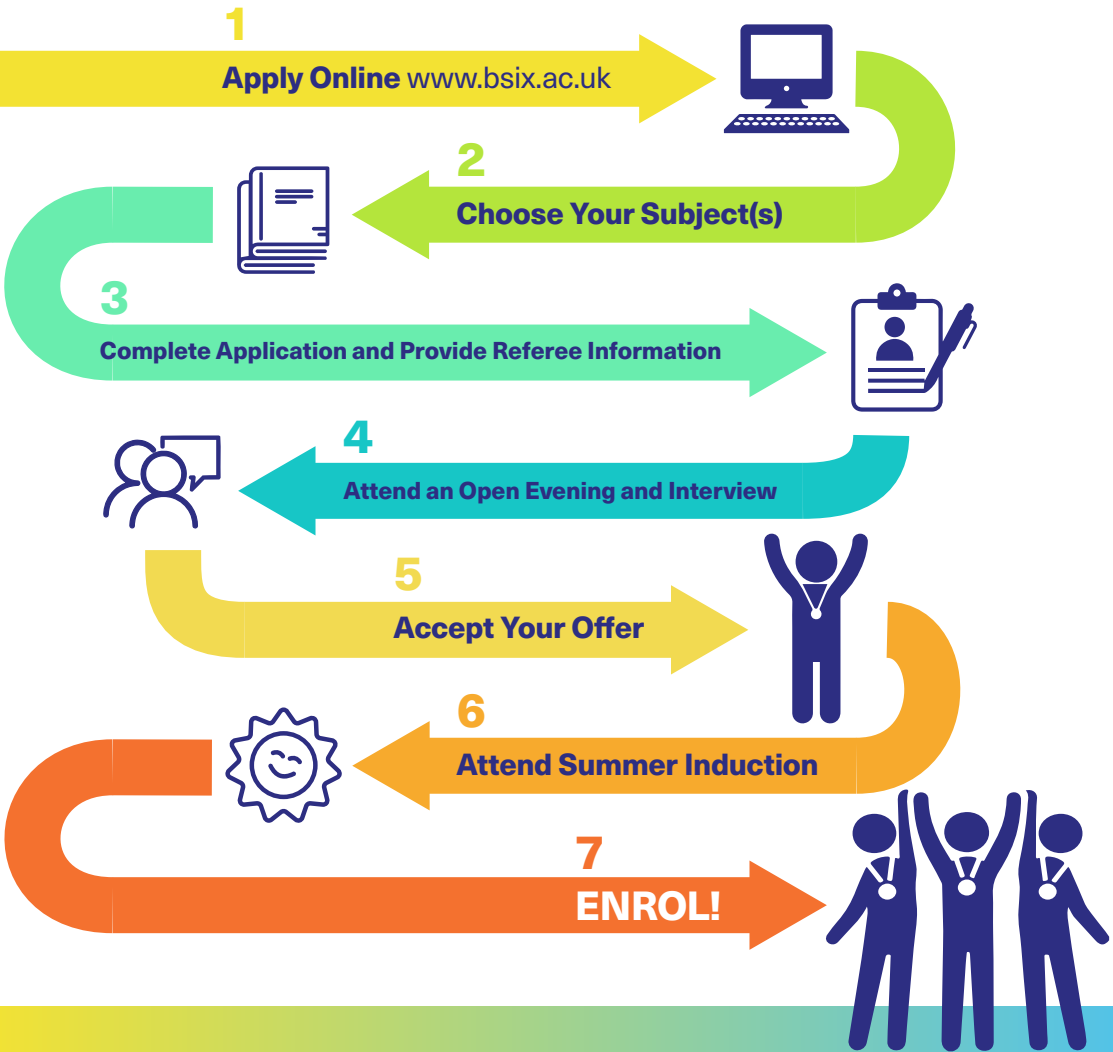

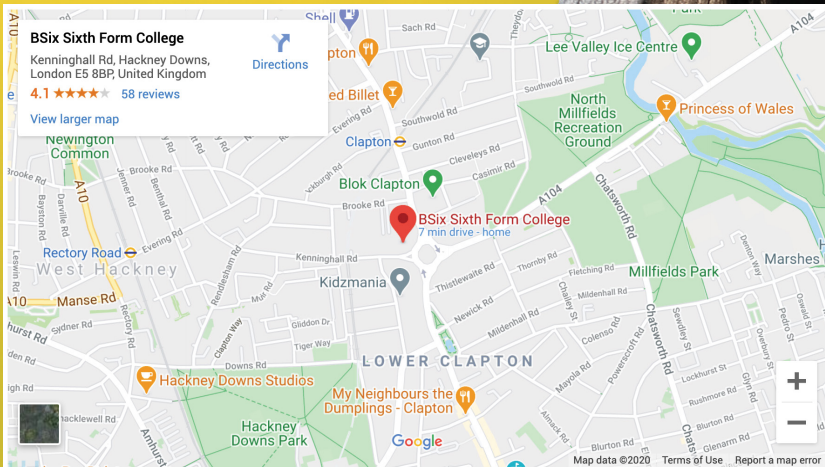
