



Provision for Vulnerable Students

The following provision is based on the premise that key staff concerned do not become ill nor require self-isolation due to symptoms of the coronavirus.

1. Following the recent announcement by the Prime Minister and Secretary of State for Education, BSix College will be closed to all students from 5pm on Friday 20th March.
2. The exception to this are:
 - Students with an Education Health and Care Plan
 - Students that are from families currently working with Social Care
3. BSix College will remain open to provide the most vulnerable students a safe learning environment to complete curriculum work.
4. The College has:
 - 40 students with Education Health and Care Plans
 - 17 students on Supported Internships
 - 20 students who are on Alternative Provision (Pre-16)
 - 51 students who are in families working with Social Services (Looked After Children, Care Leavers and Child in Need)
5. Subject teachers have set all students with enough curriculum work to complete until the 3rd April, at which point a review will take place. Staffing for vulnerable students will largely be based on volunteers of college teaching and support staff.
6. The College will open the Learning Resource Centre, Inclusive Learning Centre and the Hub for those students identified in point 2.
7. Students will need to sign in each morning on arrival and sign out when they leave. College ID cards must be visible at all times.
8. The operating hours of the College are 10:00am – 2:00pm, Monday to Friday.
9. All students will receive free lunch at 1:00pm
10. Timetable structure is as follows:

1:00pm – 2:00pm	Lunch
2:00pm	Close



11. Attendance of students that are on Alternative Provision programmes will be checked at 12:00 noon and sent to Christine Carroll, who in turn will inform the relevant borough.
12. A member of the Senior Management Team will be present each day to address any issues or needs.
13. Senior Management will monitor the provision daily and will update all parents, students, staff and stakeholders of any further announcements/changes by the government
14. Whilst the College understands that a large proportion of students are disadvantaged and may not have access to IT resources, the College must follow the advice from the government and put in place provision for **only** those students that have been identified as vulnerable.
15. Some parents may wish to keep their child at home and access learning using online technology. Non-take up of access to the College may force a closure of the service.
16. All students can access their teachers by using their College email and Microsoft Teams.
